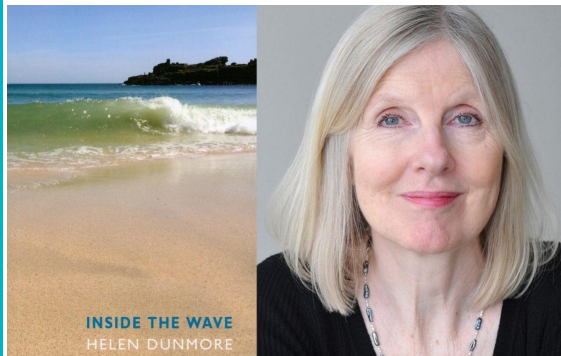

By Fleur Hitchcock

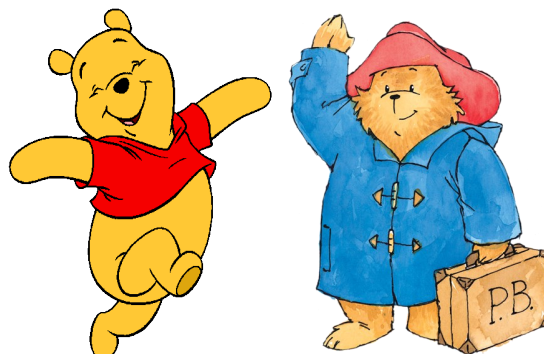
Costa Book of the Year

Congratulations to Helen Dunmore on winning the Costa Book of the Year 2017 with her book of poetry *'Inside the Wave'*. Dunmore was a novelist, short story and children's writer. Her poetry books have been given the Poetry Book Society Choice and Recommendations and won several prizes including Cardiff International Poetry prize, the Alice Hunt Bartlett Award and the Signal Poetry Award. *'Inside the Wave'* is described as being "concerned with the borderline between the living and the dead-the underworld and the human world – and the exquisitely intense being of both". Dunmore died from cancer in June 2017 and is now the second writer to win the overall prize posthumously following Ted Hughes in 1998.
