ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Applying for a place

Once you have decided that you would like your child to be considered for entry into the School, the first step is to register them, and our registry team will guide you through the admissions process.

You can complete the registration form online and the registration fee is £75 for a UK student or £195 for an international student. This non-refundable fee, covers the administration of your child's application.

Getting to know us

We encourage all prospective parents and pupils to come and visit the School as many times as they would like, in order that they should feel confident about their decision.

We hold open events throughout the academic year and these provide excellent opportunities to talk to pupils and staff and view our facilities.

We also recommend that parents and pupils visit us on an individual basis for

a private tour of the School followed by a meeting with the Headmaster, Senior Deputy Head, or member of the Senior team as appropriate.

Taster days can also be arranged if your child would like to experience Rossall first hand; these additional opportunities can prove to be beneficial in the decision-making process.

ENTRY INTO NURSERY

(AGE 0+)

Entrance Conditions

There is no formal assessment procedure for Rossall Nursery. We encourage all Nursery pupils to come and join us for a taster session prior to their start date; this enables your child to meet other pupils, enjoy the activities and start to become familiar with the setting.

A non-refundable registration fee of £75 is payable when you apply for a place in our Nursery.

The Nursery is open fifty weeks of the year, excluding Bank Holidays. The Nursery is closed for two weeks at Christmas.

Funding

Parents may claim 30 hours or 15 hours of funded childcare (dependent on eligibility) from the term following your child's third birthday.

Nursery 0+ to 2 Years - Sandpipers

Full days are offered for children aged from 3 months to 2 years. A minimum of two days a week is preferred.

Nursery 2 Years to 4 Years - Sanderlings

The day is divided into two sessions, morning and afternoon, with lunch included in the morning session.

An Early Bird Session is available	7.30am - 8.00am

Starting with a minimum of four sessions per week to begin with, upon reaching the age of 3 we recommend at least five sessions per week to enable your child to experience the full range of activities.

ENTRY INTO RECEPTION TO YEAR 6

PREPARATORY SCHOOL (AGE 4+)

Entrance Conditions

There is no formal assessment for entrance to Rossall Preparatory School. All pupils wishing to join Rossall School are invited for a taster day. The taster day provides an excellent opportunity for your child/children to spend time with their peers and experience a typical school day.

Rossall School does obtain references for all children from their previous school and parents should liaise with Registry in regards to the timing of this request.

ENTRY INTO YEAR 7 TO YEAR 11

SENIOR SCHOOL (AGE 11+)

Entrance Conditions

All pupils entering Year 7 and Year 9 will be required to sit the Rossall School Entrance Examination which comprises of written tests in the following subjects:

- English
- Mathematics
- Non-Verbal Reasoning

Pupils entering Years 8 and 10 will be required to sit placement tests in English and Mathematics.

All pupils applying for Rossall School will be required to have an interview with the Headmaster and provide a handwritten personal statement (no longer than 2 sides of A4).

Year 7 & Year 9 scholarships

Application deadline, Friday 3rd December 2021

All students participating in the Rossall School Entrance Examinations are considered for Academic Scholarships. There are additional scholarships awarded for Music, Sport, Golf, Art and Design, and Drama.

ENTRANCE AND SCHOLARSHIP PROCEDURES AND ASSESSMENTS

YEAR 7 AND 9 ENTRANCE EXAMINATIONS

English (1 hour)

The English assessment will test writing and comprehension skills. Candidates will be given a selection of titles to choose from and asked to write an essay. They will be expected to organise their work into paragraphs. The comprehension will test a candidate's ability to read text, process it and understand its meaning.

Mathematics (1 hour)

The Maths paper will test basic knowledge and skills (such as numbers, fractions, decimals, metric units of length, weight, and time) and the ability to apply this work in solving problems. The paper is based on National Curriculum requirements.

Non-Verbal Reasoning (1 hour)

The Non-Verbal Reasoning paper involves the ability to understand and analyse visual information and solve problems using visual reasoning. For example: identifying relationships, similarities and differences between shapes and patterns, recognising visual sequences and relationships between objects, and remembering these.

Art and Design

Candidates for Art and Design Scholarships are required to attend a practical test and interview with the Head of Art. Candidates will be asked to:

- Sit a practical test which will be held by the Head of Art under supervised conditions.
- Provide a portfolio of work to show their skill and interest in the subject.
- Attend a short interview where they will be asked to demonstrate their interest and experience in the subject.

Art and Design Scholars are expected to attend all the lessons provided and to participate in the exhibitions and trips to art galleries that the Art Department arranges.

Drama

Candidates for Drama Scholarships are required to attend a workshop with the Head of Drama. Candidates will be asked to:

- Prepare a short monologue (maximum three minutes) from a play of their choosing, to be learnt by heart
- Participate in a group exercise
- Attend a short interview with the Head of Drama

Drama Scholars are required to be involved in all Drama productions.

Music

Candidates for Music Scholarships are required to attend an audition and interview with the Director of Music. Candidates will be asked to:

- Play or sing two contrasting pieces on main instrument or one piece on each instrument if more than one is offered.
- Aural tests of Grade 3 (11+) or Grade 5 (13+) Identical to the ABRSM format.
- Viva Voce about candidate's musical experience and interest.
- 11+ candidates should have reached Grade 3 level and 13+ candidates, Grade 5 level in their main instrument.

Music Scholars are expected to attend all the lessons provided and to participate in the ensembles and engagements that the Music Department arranges. These may involve weekends and after school events which will take priority over other commitments outside of the School.

Sport

Sporting Scholarships will be awarded to those who can demonstrate a high level of ability across a range of different sporting activities, and who show an outstanding attitude and commitment to the School and their own development. Candidates will be assessed on their current level of competency and future potential.

As part of the process there will also be an interview with the Director of Sport. Candidates will be asked to bring along a record of achievement including a reference. Full details of the sports kit candidates require will be given prior to the day.

Sports Scholars are expected to attend all the lessons provided and to participate in the activities and fixtures the Sports Department arranges. These may involve weekends and after school events which will take priority over other commitments outside of the School.

Interview with the Headmaster

Each applicant will be invited for an interview with the Headmaster and/or Senior Deputy Head. Candidates will be asked to bring along something they are proud of, as well as two passport-sized photographs.

ENTRY INTO YEAR 12

SIXTH FORM (AGE 16+)

Entrance Conditions

All candidates seeking entry to Sixth Form will be required to pass at least five GCSE/IGCSE subjects (Grades 5–9) (or equivalent qualifications from the student's own country) as well as provide a satisfactory report from their present school. Please note that in order to study certain subjects, candidates will need to have achieved a Grade 6 or 7 in that subject (or related discipline) at GCSE/IGCSE (see individual subject requirements for further details).

Year 12 Scholarships

Application deadline, Friday 3rd December 2021

All candidates who have applied to sit the Sixth Form scholarship and entrance examinations will be required to sit two papers: a discursive/argumentative essay paper and a critical thinking paper. They will be interviewed by the Headmaster and/or a member of the Senior Leadership Team.

ENTRANCE AND SCHOLARSHIP PROCEDURES AND ASSESSMENTS

YEAR 12 ENTRANCE EXAMINATIONS

Assessment (2 hours)

A single paper covering:

- Discursive/argumentative essay writing
- Critical Thinking

Art and Design

Candidates for Art and Design Scholarships are required to attend a practical test and interview with the Head of Art. Candidates will be asked to:

- Sit a practical test which will be held by the Head of Art under supervised conditions.
- Provide a portfolio of work to display evidence of their skill and interest in the subject.
- Attend a short interview where they will be asked to demonstrate their interest and experience in the subject.

Art and Design Scholars are expected to attend all the lessons provided and to participate in the exhibitions and trips to art galleries that the Art Department arranges.

Drama

Candidates for Drama Scholarships are required to attend a workshop with the Head of Drama. Candidates will be asked to:

- Prepare a short monologue (maximum three minutes) from a play of their choosing, to be learnt by heart
- Participate in a group exercise
- Attend a short interview with the Head of Drama

Drama Scholars are required to be involved in all Drama productions.

Music

Candidates for Music Scholarships are required to attend an audition and interview with the Director of Music. Candidates will be asked to:

- Play or sing two contrasting pieces on their main instrument or one piece on each instrument if more than one is offered.
- Aural tests of Grade 6 standard. Identical to the ABRSM format.
- Viva Voce about candidate's musical experience and interest.
- Candidates should have reached Grade 6 level in their main instrument.

Music Scholars are expected to attend all the lessons provided and to participate in the ensembles and engagements that the Music Department arranges. These may involve weekends and after school events which will take priority over other commitments outside of the School.

Sport

Sporting Scholarships will be awarded to those who can demonstrate a high level of ability across a range of different sporting activities, and who show an outstanding attitude and commitment to the School and their own development. Candidates will be assessed on their current level of competency and future potential.

As part of the process there will also be an interview with the Director of Sport. Candidates will be asked to bring along a record of achievement including a reference. Full details of the sports kit candidates require will be given prior to the day.

Sports Scholars are expected to attend all the lessons provided and to participate in the activities and fixtures the Sports Department arranges. These may involve weekends and after school events which will take priority over other commitments outside of the School.

Interview with the Headmaster

Each applicant will be invited for an interview with the Headmaster and/or Senior Deputy Head. For applicants applying for Sports, Golf, Music, Art and Design or Drama Scholarships, these will be arranged on the same day as the auditions/trials where possible.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

Rossall awards a wide variety of scholarships each year to current and new pupils to the School. Means-tested bursaries can be offered to further supplement these awards.

We encourage all applicants to consider Rossall, regardless of whether they think they can afford the full tuition fees. We do our best to admit and support a wide variety of students from many diverse backgrounds.

Scholarships

Scholarships are awards based on merit/excellence. They are awarded for pupils entering Years 7, 9 and 12, with outstanding talent in the fields of academics, sport, music, art & design and drama.

Scholarships are reviewed annually in light of a pupil's achievement, effort, attitude and behaviour.

General scholarships in Years 7, 9 and 12 are awarded up to a maximum of 20% of the school fees.

Forces Bursaries

If a CEA allowance is awarded by the MOD, Rossall will provide an additional discount, such that the minimum parental contribution permissible under MOD CEA rules is made. Currently the MOD asks that eligible personnel make a minimum contribution of 10% towards the school fees.

If a CEA allowance is not available, Rossall are able to award a discount of up to 25% to forces families.

Clergy Bursaries

Rossall School was founded in 1844 by Rev. St Vincent Beechey. Its establishment was 'to provide, at a moderate cost, for the sons of Clergymen and others, a classical, mathematical and general education of the highest class.'

To this day, our commitment to supporting the sons and daughters of clergymen and women continues and we offer a substantial non-means-tested bursary award for each child.

Bursary Scheme*

A Bursary is a form of financial assistance which is means tested. Bursary awards may be available if we feel your child would make a valuable contribution to our School, but in your current circumstances, you are unable to afford the full fees. Bursary awards depend entirely on your family's disposable income and assets and all applicants are required to disclose, in confidence, their financial details on our Bursary Application Form, before a decision can be reached. If you feel you may be eligible for Bursary assistance, please contact the Admissions Team for an application form. Completed Bursary forms must be returned to: Bursary, Rossall School, Fleetwood, Lancashire, FY7 8JW

**Bursary applications for entry into Rossall will only be considered from September to April preceding the year of entry when bursary support is needed.*

Payment of Fees

Paying by Direct Debit is the School's preferred payment option. The fees can be debited on a monthly basis from August to May or paid termly and debited on the first day of term.

FEES AND FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Fee Increase and Notice

Rossall School will give at least one term's notice of any increase in the fees*. In return, Rossall School requires a full term's notice if parents decide to remove their child from the School for any reason, failing which a full term's fees are payable at the full published price irrespective of any financial assistance the pupil may receive.

School Meal Fees

Please note school meals are compulsory for all day pupils. The termly fees* for the academic year 2021 are as follows:

Insurance

Students are automatically covered for Personal Accident and Dental Insurance unless parents inform us that they wish to opt out. Students are not covered for BUPA Medical Insurance unless parents inform us in writing that they wish to opt in. Premiums will be charged in advance each term on the fee invoice.

BOARDING INFORMATION

House System

Rossall has a house system from Reception through to Year 13.

In Preparatory School children are split between Assheton, Clifton and Hesketh houses.

Anchor House is home to our boarding community from Year 3 to Year 8. While living in Anchor, students have a Preparatory or Senior house allegiance for activities such as sports.

From Year 7, students are split between 8 houses. Dolphin, Rose and Wren are Rossall girls' houses. Dragon, Maltese Cross, Mitre Fleur-de-lys, Pelican, and Spread Eagle are Rossall boys' houses. Boarders move into rooms in their Senior Houses in Year 9.

House allocations may be determined by siblings. Eg, a boy enrolling in Year 7 with a brother in Year 12 will be in the same Senior House.

If you are an Old Rossallian, you can request your child is in the same house, however, places cannot always be guaranteed.

Day Boarding

Introduced to accommodate wrap-around care and the timetables of our Academy students, Day Boarding allows students who return home at the end of each day access to breakfast and evening meals in the Dining Hall, extended access to study areas across the campus, and improved support for training and practice in Signature programmes and academies.

Weekly Boarding

A flexible option for boarding students who are able to travel home for the weekend. Weekly boarding allows the full boarding experience over five nights.

Flexi Boarding

A flexi boarding option is often useful for pupils with additional sporting, rehearsal or other extra-curricular commitments. You can book in your child for a single night, or multiple nights, you will be billed per night. This can be done as a regular booking or as and when it is required. Spaces are limited and cannot be guaranteed.

The Application Process

You will need to complete the forms listed below to apply for a Rossall School Scholarship. Before you begin the process, for ease, we have identified the documents you will need prior to completing the forms.

1. Registration Form

- **A copy of the child's passport**
- Name and address of child's current school
- Name of the current Head Teacher at your child's school
- How long child has been at their school
- Details of parent(s)/guardian(s)
- Hobbies of child
- Details of any special needs or disabilities your child may have
- Details of any medication and/or medical conditions your child has
- Electronic signature of parent(s)/guardian(s)
- **A payment of £75 for the Registration Fee**

2. Scholarship Application Form

All applicants:

- A copy of your child's passport
- **Copies of your child's last two school reports**
- **A handwritten personal statement from your child***
- A registration fee of £75 (please note, if you have already registered for Rossall and paid this, you do not need to pay again).

Sixth Form applicants:

- Your child's predicted GCSE grades. Please do not worry if you do not yet know these.
- Your child's preferred subjects they wish to study at either A Level or IB.

Sports Scholarship Applicants

- Which sport(s) your child wants to be considered for
- Their current playing level (*e.g. regional, national, club, county etc*)
- Supporting information (*e.g. plays for Manchester United Youth U14s Team*)
- Sporting achievements and awards (*e.g. Player of the Year 2018 at Wyre Netball Club*)
- Sports Reference (*e.g. a coach or trainer - please note, we will be contacting the named person for confirmation*)

*Personal Statement – This should be handwritten on an A4 sheet of paper, no more than two sides in length. **Please do not submit typed personal statements, they must be handwritten.** You can include any details which you think will be of interest to the person assessing your application. For example, family; hobbies and interests; ambitions and the reasons you would like to attend Rossall.

We are unable to process any applications without the above listed items, provision of a recent school report, and the payment of the registration fee, or applications submitted after the application date.
